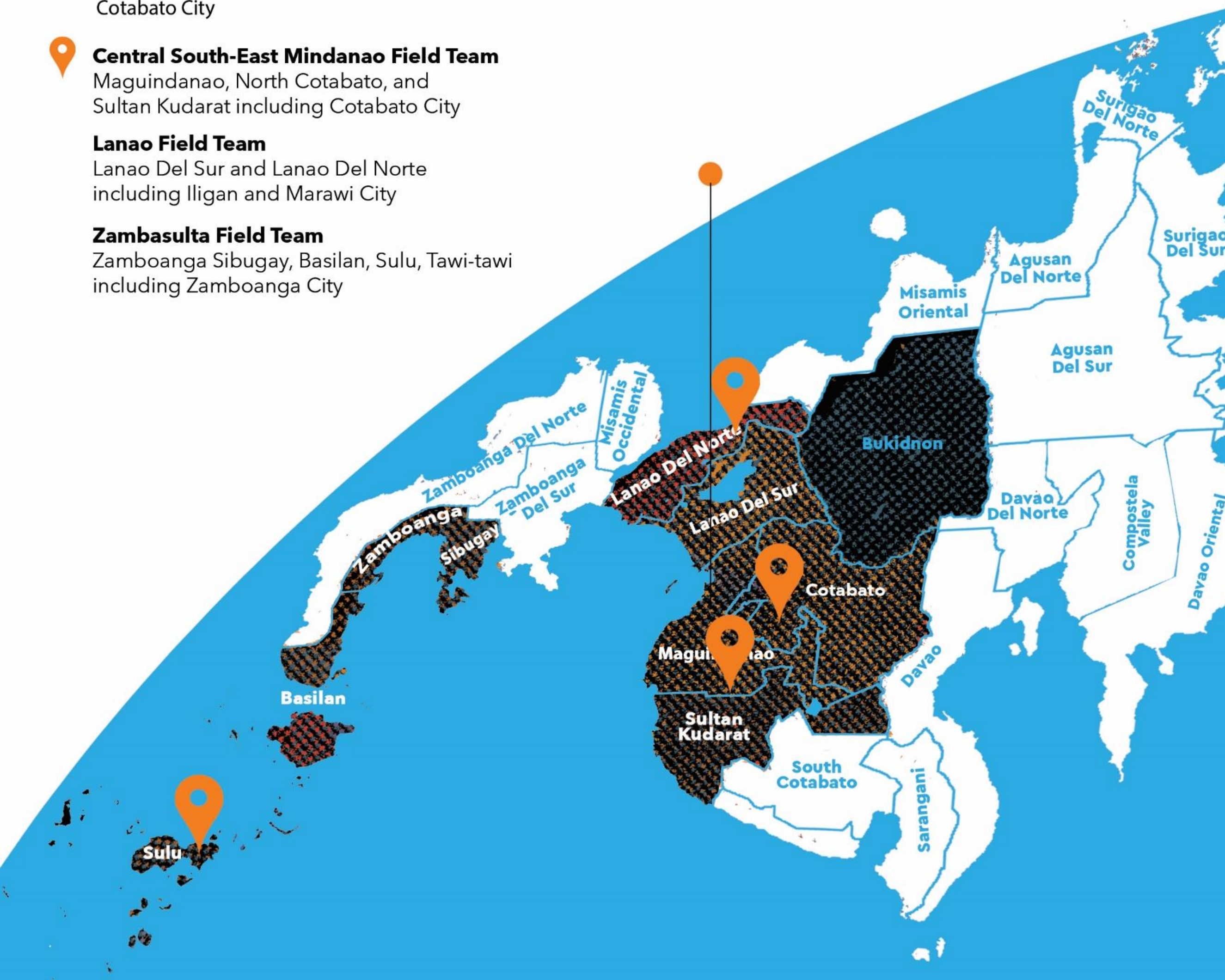


OUR PRESENCE IN MINDANAO

NP is an implementing organization of the ongoing peace process between the Moro Islamic Liberation Front and the Philippine government. Our mandate for implementing the peace process includes:

- Monitoring and reporting individuals' concerns about safety.
- Protective accompaniment for civilians and organizations in areas of conflict, including;
 - NP team members accompanying hostage survivors to reunite with their families.
 - NP monitors whether conflicting parties are abiding by ceasefire agreements, and it verifies and reports compliance and noncompliance of agreements.
 - NP creates safe spaces for peaceful dialogue between different stakeholders in the country, including local institutions, for community-based conflict prevention and conflict resolution.
 - Training local leaders and organizations in UCP methodologies for monitoring, unarmed peacekeeping and civilian protection.

BEFORE CONDUCTING RETRIEVAL

How did we gain access with the community before Marawi siege?

NPP started the coordination meeting in which stakeholders was provided safe and neutral space to discuss and address issues and concerns in the ground. With this, NPP has gained trust and confidence with the members of Ceasefire Mechanism both with MILF and GPH.

NPP team was also the one who suggested to create a mechanism/ team who can assist in the retrieval and rescue of the trapped civilian inside the main affected areas.

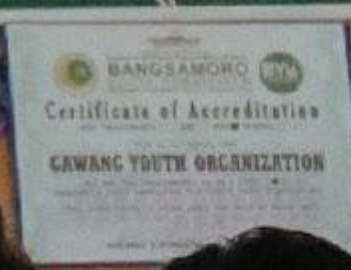

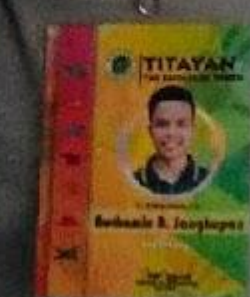

NONVIOLENT PEACEFORCE IN THE PHILIPPINES

Protecting civilians and building peace through the years

NP is one of the international NGOs with presence and access to conflict-torn areas across Mindanao. In 2007, NP first set foot in Mindanao by invitation of various CSOs to assess the situation in the ground and introduce unarmed strategies in the protection of civilians affected by the Moro conflict. Since 2009, NP is a long standing CSO partner of the Philippine government in its peace process with the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF) being the first international NGO to become a member of the International Monitoring Team (IMT) under its Civilian Protection Component (CPC). Recently, NP was able to get the official recognition of the Joint Normalization Committee (JNC) to participate in supporting and complementing the Bangsamoro normalization processes on the ground. Moreover, NP has received a plaque of appreciation from the Office of the Presidential Adviser on Peace, Reconciliation and Unity (OPAPRU) affirming NP's significant engagement in the GPH-MILF peace process and role during the Marawi Siege.

Women, Peace, & Security (WPS) Year 2018-2019
